

“Parish Council ~ Chairman’s December Update”

Hello everyone

December’s here and by the time you read this I hope the lockdown has been eased and we can move around a little more freely again and look forward to Christmas with some optimism. We still obviously need to stay vigilant and safe during these continuing challenging times and continue to be mindful of others within the community who may be struggling or need some support.

Parish Council business continues as usual, with meetings still being held in a virtual setting the main areas of business are currently:

Benches:

The PC are looking at a project for next year for possible sites for additional seating / benches around the village and details of the proposed locations should be on the website in the new year. If anyone in the village wishes to sponsor a seat / bench(s) please contact the clerk for further details.

Brook:

We continue to push the Environment Agency (EA) with regard them reviewing the brook to determine what action they will be taking to ensure there is a minimum risk to flooding.

The EA were scheduled to clear the brook during the second quarter of the year but this was postponed until the last quarter of 2020 due to staff issues and Covid19, we are awaiting confirmation of this happening or if further delays are expected.

Christmas:

Plans are already in place for the customary Christmas tree on the village green with the usual lights & trimmings etc. This year, to support Rearsby Church we also hope to be able to have nativity display around the tree for the community to enjoy however, there will be mini nativity in the Church porch.

I understand from Rita Meade that a notice has gone out for people to turn on their Christmas lights Friday 18th – Saturday 19th December 5 - 8 pm to light up the village.

No maps or competitions this year, just a walk around to enjoy the displays.

I understand there will also be a Christmas tree in the Church yard and people have been asked to buy a wooden bauble to personalise, decorate and add a message. Rearsby school children have been asked to bring £1 per bauble, in an envelope, to school or anyone can buy a bauble from Beardsley’s with all proceeds to Rearsby Church.

Why not hang yours on the Christmas tree in the Church yard. I believe

There is also a suggestion for people to paint a stone with a Christmas scene and leave around the village for people to find.

Finally, people are being encouraged to draw or paint a Christmas scene or Nativity and put them in their window in early December so families can take an Advent walk to see as many as they can.

Church:

I would just like to say a big thank you to vicar Mary for her excellent work over the past months, especially with her zoom services on Sundays and in particular her Remembrance Day service on the 8th November. I understand there are plans for a Christmas Eve Service Candle lit communion service at 6.00pm in Rearsby Church (Covid safe; please wear a mask).

During these very unusual times we are very blessed to have such an active and thoughtful vicar within our community. Thank you, Mary, God Bless you.

Conker Field:

The tree management work project will hopefully conclude during December, the new hedge on Station road will be planted late November and plans to plant new replacement trees will be reviewed in the new year. The new entrance sign will hopefully be fitted during December and other signage as soon as possible. The new litter bins have been chased again with CBC and we hope to have some good news before the new year.
